One of the central nodes in the philosophical approach behind Reggio Emilia pedagogy is the importance given to educational documentation. Documentation that *spreads*, developed little by little in Infant-toddler Centres and Preschools and leading progressively to publications, exhibitions and books. Against this background a sort of "micro-publishing" has taken shape, at once artisanal and digital, unusual both in quality and quantity. This material is designed and realised directly by teachers, atelieristas and pedagogistas inside the centres themselves and the protagonists - always are the children, their voices, their thoughts, their theories.



The Expressive Languages of Children The Artistic Language of Alberto Burri

The intrinsic structure of creative languages means they are capable of keeping rationality and imagination, cognitivity and sensibility closely bound together, making them one of the most effective antibodies against violence and one of the most responsive in listening to others and the world.

In Reggio Emilia from November 2001 to January 2002 an exhibition was held of work by Alberto Burri, the renowned artist working in the second half of the twentieth century. The exhibition became an occasion for exploring and setting forth some of the possibilities for encounter and re-elaboration between children (0-13) and works of art, both theoretically and practically.

The exhibition and catalogue, both entitled "The expressive language of children, the artistic language of Alberto Burri" can be used for professional growth by those interested in exploring these ideas. (English and Italian)



The Hundred Languages of Children

A travelling exhibition on children's creativity. The original name of the exhibition was "If the eye jumps over the wall" and it was conceived in 1980 by Loris Malaguzzi and his closest collaborators to testify to research in the areas of pedagogy and creativity of the early childhood centres in Reggio. Since that first version the exhibition has been shown in countries on all five continents in various updated editions and in several languages under its new name of "The hundred languages of children", and it is constantly showed in Italy and all around the world, offered as a space for reciprocal exchange and reflection.
